LITERACY AND NUMERACY (NAPLAN)

Notice to Parents

Federally mandated, Australia wide NAPLAN testing of all Year 3 and Year 5 students will take place on **Tuesday May 9, Wednesday May 10 and Thursday May 11**. At this stage, it is anticipated that the testing will be carried out in the students' classrooms according to the following schedule.

Tuesday May 9	Wednesday May 10	Thursday May 11
9am Language Conventions (40 mins)	9am Reading (45/50 mins)	9am Numeracy (45/50 mins)

Writing (40 mins) *Lower time is Yr 3, Higher time is Yr 5

Parents of students in Years 3 or 5 should have been given a pamphlet with further details. Students who have a disability may require adaptations to sit the test or may be unable to participate. If this is the case, please discuss this with their class teacher. Parents who are philosophically opposed to NAPLAN testing will need to put this in writing to the school to exempt their child. Please speak to your child's class teacher or to Alison Robb, Monique Smith or Pamela Chatfield if you have any particular concerns.

ICAS TESTING

The University of New South Wales is offering your child an opportunity to participate in the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS). ICAS assessments have taken place annually in schools for over thirty years and in 20 countries. Educational Assessment Australia (EAA) design and deliver the assessments and is an arm of the University of New South Wales. Please be aware that these assessments are competitively based and may be conducted before school. Some are conducted in May and others in August.

As entries are administered through the school, you can apply through the school by filling out and returning with payment the form held at the front office. Please return the form to the School Administration before 31 March, 2017 – Late entries will incur extra costs.

PERSONAL PROPERTY INCL IPADS & MOBILE PHONES

Just a reminder that students should not have any electronic devices on them or in their bags/trays etc during the school day. Nor should they have favourite toys, cards or games. If students need to bring Ipads or mobile phones with them to school, they must hand them in to the front office at the beginning of the day and then collect them at the end of the day. RIDING BIKES TO SCHOOL

Please talk with your children about safety when riding to and from school. Children are allowed to ride on pavements however they must ride with caution and appropriate speed. We have had a number of very concerned homeowners, especially along Victoria Street, contacting us to say that children were riding very quickly along the footpath. They would not be able to stop safely if a car reversed from a driveway. It is also law that all children wear helmets while cycling. This is particularly important when coming to and from school. Cyclists can be fined \$50 for not wearing an appropriately fastened helmet. If your child does not have a helmet please purchase one prior to them cycling to school.

CAT or AMC MATHS TESTING FOR YEARS 5 & 6

Registration for all Australian Mathematics Trust competitions has now opened! Computational and Algorithmic Thinking (CAT) is first up, scheduled for 21 March, and is available in paper or online format.

Students have an hour to complete the paper, which contains 9 problems that require logical and algorithmic thinking. This includes six multiple-choice questions that are relatively easy to solve, followed by three more challenging questions.

In 2017, the AMT is offering a package of the CAT and the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) for the discounted price of **\$10 per student**. You can also ensure that your students are prepared and ready to go by adding the training programs GetSet CAT or GetSet AMC to any order for \$2 per student. Please fill in the same form as the ICAS testing and return to the office by 27 February along with the payment.

This program focuses on developing children's speech and language skills, with this session focussing on the chirpy chatter of magpies. Children will make a magpie mask to chirp with.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

We know that every day that a child is absent from school has an impact on their learning. For this reason, it is a legal requirement that students attend school and, when they can't, parents need to contact the school and explain why and for how long the student is likely to be away (sick, family emergency etc). This means that the school knows if there are ongoing issues and your child or family needs support. We can also plan to help your child catch up on what they missed to minimise the impact on learning. At Mosman Park, we see ourselves as a community which works together to develop happy, healthy children with lifelong learning habits, and we work together with families and the community to make this happen.
