

SCIENCE UPDATE from the DEAF SCHOOL

Students in years 5 and 6 have been exploring the solar system. In their quest to investigate the 4 terrestrial planets they observed pictures taken from NASA space vehicles and created model landscapes depicting features such as craters, valleys and volcanoes found on the planets.

They drew upon features from the rocky planets, Mars, Mercury Venus and Earth to create their own planet, maybe just like one of the planets that have been recently discovered within another solar in the universe.

To develop an understanding of the exploration carried out by astronauts and space probes collecting samples from the terrain students engaged in a simulated activity where they took core samples for analyse of small chocolate bars noting textures, colours and build-up of layers. Students will further consolidate their understandings with a visit to the planetarium at Scitech today.



Students' in the middle years have been exploring one of Earth's most precious resources Water and how it is essential to life.



They began their investigations by taking an audit on how water is used around the school identifying drink fountains, wash basins, toilets and kitchens. They also noted the visible water pipes and irrigation areas around the school. Students modelled and shared their observations of what happens when rain soaks in and runs off different surfaces. They also simulated how to collect ground water using eye droppers to pump up underground water stored below pebbles. Students made Paper Mountains and shared their observations about the movement of water identifying rivers, dams and reservoirs as places where rainwater

collects. They used their observations to create a model landscape where water runs and collects in rivers, dams, lakes and oceans. Links to Science and Engineering were made when students created their own rain water tank towers and tested their strength and stability as their captured rain water. They also created alfoil boats testing out what shape carried the most weight.
