DEAF SCHOOL SCIENCE UPDATE

What's the go in Science this term?

The year 2 and 3 students have been exploring what animals share the Mosman Park school grounds with them. As young Biologists they have begun gathering data on the diverse types of animals that reside in the school grounds. Last week students brought back to class worms, slaters and an ear wick to further study up close and note their distinguishing features.

The class intends to investigate how animals can be grouped according to their key features using a branching key. Students will then decide on their favourite animal to create a 3D print of.

The year 4,5 .6 students have also been exploring the school grounds in search of Eucalyptus trees. The students were able to use a key biologist used to identify the Eucalyptus species. By holding leaves up to the light to identify small yellow spots of oil, crushing leaves to identify the unique smell of Eucalyptus oil and identifying trees carrying the unique fruit of the gum nut they noted the school grounds supports many of these unique species of trees. Their future exploration of this plant of over 900 species will be to explore the animals that rely on the tree for food and shelter and investigate how to and germinate the seeds from the fruits. With most honey in Australia supplies by the Eucalyptus species the Students will be exploring how bees play a part in pollinating the flowers of the eucalyptus tree and how bees use the nectar to make their honey.

Students will be using 3 D software to design and engineer a 3D honey bee drinking platform and a seed capsule to print out.



Kindy and Pre-Primary students will be exploring the new robots to begin their journey into coding. They will have mazes to navigate and create and will be involved in hands on fun coding challenges to develop their skills in robotics, stayed tuned for how they are able to navigate the robots to engage in learning experiences across learning areas Come and have a look at the new robots we have purchased to assist all students to further develop their coding skills in STEM,


