FROM THE PRINCIPALS

There have been so many changes occurring in the school at the moment, which are causing some interruptions to our day to day operations. But it has been so interesting watching the courtyard transform before our eyes and we are now excited to see the result as everything finishes this week. As our school grows in student numbers, it can not grow in size, so we decided it was time to upgrade this space which is used by hundreds of students every day. With that in mind, the Deaf School have funded the laying of the artificial turf and rubber soft fall.

The artificial turf with the hand ball courts has made that area look cooler and much more inviting and it will hopefully mean less injuries when students fall over. Already the children are enjoying their picnics on the grass under our majestic fig tree. The rubber soft fall is also looking great and will be much kinder to knees than the bitumen it has replaced.

When you get an opportunity, look a bit closer at the soft fall area. The design reflects our 'river to sea' identity and it has six pictures which are symbolic of the Noongar Six Seasons. The natural slope of that area leads us to the art work on the side of the stage. This was designed by students of the deaf school when they studied the local wildlife area with Wadjuk Noongar artist, Sharyn Egan.

There will also be two outdoor ping pong tables which will be painted with designs created by our students and will offer another option for our active kids during their break times. These were provided by our school P and C and I'm sure they will be a very popular option for students.

In week seven the Deaf School will be hosting an Auslan Arvo for both schools. This will involve games, performances and some students from the Shenton College Auslan Program will also be visiting. It will be a great opportunity to celebrate the bilingual/bicultural aspect of our schools and more information will come out shortly.
