INTERSCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY COMPETITION

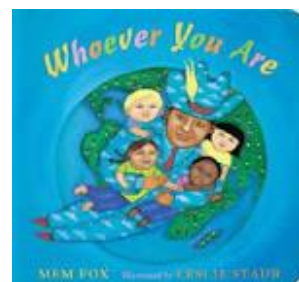
