FROM THE PRINCIPALS

School is Back!!

After working through a number of changes due to the Covid19 restrictions, it is wonderful to finally have most of our children back at school. We would like to thank our whole school community of students, staff and families for the amazing ways you adapted to all of the changing conditions; all put in place to maintain our safety.

Now that face to face learning is back, we still ask that students continue to be dropped off and picked up at the school access points. At school we will maintain the extra levels of cleaning which is being done continuously throughout the day and we will continue with various forms of social distancing which we have in place inside the school. Most importantly at this time we ask all staff and students to stay home if they are feeling unwell.

The Director General of Education, Lisa Rodgers, has been working closely with schools throughout this unprecedented time; putting into place a number of new measures in order to address the changing situation. One such change will be seen at the end of term when students bring home their school reports. While teachers will be commenting on student progress, the semester one reports will not include the A-E grades. Explanatory notes will be included in the report which will outline the Department reasoning for this change.

Over the last few weeks, we have had workmen installing the latest addition to our nature play areas around the school. Because we have such a small space at school, we are really trying to maximise the use of all areas. Our new nature play uses some of the land that was previously fenced off for the kitchen garden. This was prime real estate in the centre of the school which we felt was not being used to its fullest potential. This area has been designed to be very different from our beautiful Beedawong area, with more core strength and vestibular challenges incorporated as the children navigate across the ropes. I'm sure you will see from the photos in this newsletter, this area has been an absolute hit with our active Mosman Park kids.

I heard there was a bit of room in this fortnight's newsletter so here's a recipe for Banana Cake courtesy of a group of women from Kondinin, a shire in the WA Wheatbelt area east of Perth.

'Amazing Banana Cake'

Ingredients

- 4 eggs
- 1 ½ cups sugar
- 175ml extra light or pure olive oil
- 100ml milk
- 1 ¼ cups mashed ripe bananas (about 3)
- 2 cups self raising flour

Method

- Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan forced.
 - Grease and line pans with baking paper or grease and flour muffin pans.
- Using an electric mixer, beat eggs and sugar in mixing bowl until thick and fluffy.
- Add oil and milk and beat to combine.
- Stir in bananas and fold in flour.
- Pour into prepared pans/tins and bake as directed below, or until a skewer comes out clean.
- Cool on wire racks.

Notes:

- Makes 2 x 20cm (1.5L) ring pans, baked for 45-50 minutes.
- 20-40 x ½ cup muffins, baked for 20-25 minutes.
- 2 standard loaf tins or 2 deeps 20cm round pans, baked for 50 minutes.
- Suitable to freeze
- Can vary this recipe with these flavourings – 1 tsp vanilla essence or ground cinnamon, 1-2 tbsp lemon juice, ½ cup dark chocolate chips or 1/3 cup coconut.


