I liked the Cheerios. I was happy when I tasted them. It took a long time to count to 44. The playdough was FUN too. Anthony Willems Year 2



Our Kindergarten teacher Denise Barnett will read this story by Pamela Allen.


This program focuses on developing children's speech and language skills, with this session focussing on the chirpy chatter of magpies. Children will make a magpie mask to chirp with.

2014 HOUSE SWIMMING CARNIVAL

Buckland Dominate in Swimming House Carnival Last Thursday, at the Claremont Aquatic Centre, students from Mosman Park Primary School participated in the annual House Swimming Carnival for 2014.

Students from Years 1-3 participated in a variety of events in the 25m pool and had a wonderful time. Thank you to the Junior School staff and parent helpers for making the Junior Swimming Carnival a wonderful event.

In the senior school competition, Buckland House carried on from where they left off in 2013 by claiming back to back House Swimming titles. Bien Castledine and Yzabella Tiamzon, Buckland House Captains said before the carnival that they were quietly confident and that their team had the talent and depth to put the other Houses under pressure. Baldwin and Stirling Houses were pretty confident with their swimmers however they were concerned about Buckland's overall swimming speed especially in the relay events.

During the early stages of the meet, swimmers from all Houses performed extremely well with all Houses gaining places in all of the events. In the latter stages of the carnival, Buckland House was able to stamp their authority and pull away to take the title.

The final event was the Celebrity race where our top swimmers had the opportunity to swim against Lennard Bremer. Lennard is one of the state's top 100m and 200m breaststroke swimmers. He recently returned from the NSW State Swim Meet where he came 2nd in the 200m breaststroke race behind international Japanese swimming champion, Ippei Watanabe.

Lennard gave our swimmers a head start in the 50m freestyle event however there appeared to be a large wave forming in Lane 1 yet no swimmer was to be seen. 20m later from the start, Lennard's head popped out of the water in Lane 1 and he began to swim at an incredible speed. Our swimmers were able to hold him back for most of the race however in the last 25m he took control of the race and touched the wall first. Thank you to our wonderful champion swimmers who participated in this special race and a special thank you to Hayden Williams from School Sport WA and Lennard Bremer who came on behalf of the Swimming WA Ambassador Program. Finally, thank you to the staff for all their hard work during the day and a special thank you to the parent volunteers who gave up their time to come and help with the running of the carnival. Well done to Ms Fiona Irvine, our PE specialist, who put in many hours of work to make this carnival a fantastic success. SUN SAFETY

With the hot weather approaching, it is important to talk to your children about sun safety and teach them good sun protection habits.

Slip on some sun-protective clothing – that covers as much skin as possible

Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.

Slap on a hat – that protects your face, head, neck and ears

Seek shade

Slide on some sunglasses – make sure they meet Australian Standards.
